**NOTICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE
CHARGES AND OPPORTUNITY
FOR AN ADJUDICATIVE
PROCEEDING**

I.

The Washington State Gambling Commission issued Alonzo Clemons license number 68-06268, authorizing Card Room Employee activity with Roman Casino in Seattle.

The license expires on November 1, 2011, and was issued subject to the licensee's compliance with state gambling laws and rules.

II.

Rick Day, Director of the Washington State Gambling Commission, charges the licensee with the following violations of the Washington State Gambling Act, 9.46 RCW, and WAC Title 230:

- 1) The licensee failed to pay court-ordered fines and fees. He currently owes \$4,834, which has been sent to collections and resulted in the court issuing 10 Failures to Appear to the licensee. Additionally, the licensee has had 25 infractions for failing to have a valid driver's license and seven infractions for failing to have motor vehicle insurance.
- 2) Through his actions and infraction history, the licensee has demonstrated willful disregard for complying with ordinances, statutes, or court orders, whether at the local, state, or federal level.
- 3) Based on the licensee's failure to pay court-ordered court fines and fees, the licensee poses a threat to the effective regulation of gaming and enhances the chance of unfair illegal practices. Therefore, the licensee has failed to establish by clear and convincing evidence the necessary qualifications for licensure under RCW 9.46.153(1).
- 4) Therefore, under RCW 9.46.075(1) and (8), and WAC 230-03-085(1), (3), and (8), grounds exist to suspend or revoke Alonzo Clemons' license.

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RCW 9.46.075 Denying, suspending, or revoking an application, license or permit

The Commission may deny an application, or suspend or revoke any license or permit issued by it, for any reason or reasons, it deems to be in the public interest. These reasons shall include, but not be limited to, cases wherein the applicant or licensee, or any person with any interest therein: (The following subsections apply.)

(1) Has violated, failed or refused to comply with the provisions, requirements, conditions, limitations or duties imposed by chapter 9.46 RCW and any amendments thereto, or any rules adopted by the Commission pursuant thereto, or when a violation of any provision of chapter 9.46 RCW, or any Commission rule, has occurred upon any premises occupied or operated by any such person or over which he or she has substantial control.

(8) Fails to prove, by clear and convincing evidence, that he is qualified in accordance with the provisions of this chapter.

WAC 230-03-085 Denying, suspending, or revoking an application, license or permit

We may deny, suspend, or revoke any application, license or permit, when the applicant, licensee, or anyone holding a substantial interest in the applicant's or licensee's business or organization:

(The following subsections apply.)

(1) Commits any act that constitutes grounds for denying, suspending, or revoking licenses or permits under RCW 9.46.075.

(3) Has demonstrated willful disregard for complying with ordinances, statutes, administrative rules, or court orders, whether at the local, state, or federal level.

(8) Poses a threat to the effective regulation of gambling, or creates or increases the likelihood of unfair or illegal practices, methods, and activities in the conduct of gambling activities, as demonstrated by: (a) Prior activities; or (b) Criminal record; or (c) Reputation; or (d) Habits; or (e) Associations.

RCW 9.46.153(1) Applicants and licensees-Responsibilities and duties

(The following subsection applies.)

It shall be the affirmative responsibility of each applicant and licensee to establish by clear and convincing evidence the necessary qualifications for licensure of each person required to be qualified under this chapter, as well as the qualifications of the facility in which the licensed activity will be conducted.


Jurisdiction of this proceeding is based on 9.46 RCW, Gambling, chapter 34.05 RCW, the Administrative Procedure Act, WAC Title 230.

The licensee will have the opportunity to have a hearing on the alleged violations. **In order to have a hearing or discuss settlement options**, the enclosed request for hearing must be completed and returned to the Gambling Commission **within 23 days** from the date of the mailing of this notice.

Based on RCW 34.05.440, failure to return a request for hearing will result in the entry of a default order REVOKING your license.
