Executive Session Call to Order

Chair Sizemore called the April Gambling Commission Meeting to order at 10:05 a.m. and immediately went into Executive Session to discuss Tribal Negotiations, Pending Investigations and Litigation. Executive Session ended at 12:30 p.m.

Public Session Call to Order

Chair Sizemore called the Gambling Commission meeting to order at 12:40 p.m. and welcomed everyone to the Heathman Lodge, Vancouver WA. Chair Sizemore asked for a moment of silence to recognize law enforcement officers across the country that were lost in the line of duty.

There were 25 people in attendance.

Tab 1

Consent Agenda:

Commissioner Patterson moved to approve the consent agenda as presented by staff with adjustments removing Kelly's Bar and Grill Cardroom Licensee and Cowlitz Indian Tribe Class III certifications from the consent agenda.

Commissioner Troyer seconded the Motion.

The Motion passed. 5:0

Commissioner Patterson moved to approve the new license for Kelly's Bar and Grill as presented.

Commissioner Troyer seconded the motion.

The motion passed 4:0 Commissioner Levy abstained.

Commissioner Patterson moved to approve the Cowlitz Indian Tribe Class III Gaming Employee Certifications as presented.

Commission Troyer seconded the motion.

The motion passed. 4:0

Commissioner Stearns abstained.

Commissioner Patterson moved to approve the Snoqualmie Class III Gaming Employees Certifications as presented.

Commissioner Troyer seconded the Motion.

The Motion passed. 4:0

Commissioner Stearns abstained.

Chair Sizemore introduced the Commissioners at the table and the newest Commissioner Ms. Alicia Levy to the audience. Commissioner Levy is an attorney specializing in business law, estate planning and real estate law. She completed her undergraduate work at Washington State University in 2003 and graduated from Gonzaga University School of Law in 2010. Commissioner Levy gained experience working in larger law firms in the region before starting her own firm in Spokane in 2015. Welcome Commissioner Levy.

Director's Report

Director Trujillo welcomed everyone to the Heathman Lodge as well as welcoming Commissioner Levy to the Gambling Commission. He started his report by highlighting the recent ruling by the U.S. Supreme Court that strikes down the federal law (Professional and Amateur Sports Protection Act) prohibiting most U.S. states from authorizing sports betting. He explained that sports betting is still illegal in Washington State. Churchill Downs may request a larger group of Ninth Circuit judges review and issue a decision or appeal to the U.S. Supreme Court if the review request is denied or the review does not overturn the decision. Additional lawsuits have been filed against at least five other free-to-play casino game sites. These have been filed in US District Court in Seattle and Tacoma. In order for sports betting to become legal in Washington, the Legislature would need to vote to authorize it. The Gambling Commission has received several calls from customers, saying that some online social gaming platforms not allowing Washington residents access to their sites. He reminds everyone that the discontinuance of service to Washington residents is a business choice, and all communication should be directed to the respective online businesses. Director Trujillo says that this is a significant decision that will likely change the landscape of gambling in the United States. He also commented on the general fund's state appropriation of \$50,000 for the Gambling Commission to contract for a study to look at services available to problem and pathological gamblers and their families for Washington. The release of these state appropriated funds is contingent upon securing matching funds. The study is due to the legislature on February 15th, 2019. The study should be presented to the Commissioners at the January 10, 2019 Commission public meeting to consider policy recommendations. In order to accomplish this, the study should be to Gambling Commission staff by the first part of December 2018. Director Trujillo is hopeful for

securing a vendor by the end of June 2018. A small workgroup was formed. That work group consisted of; Chairman Ron Allen, Cowlitz Tribe of Indians; Rebecca Kaldor and Ernie Stebbins from Washington Indian Gaming Association; Ann Gray from Department of Social Health Services; Dr. Ty Lostutter from University of Washington; Dolores Chiechi director of Recreation and Gaming Association; Chris Massey, Attorney and Lobbyist, Amber Lewis. Agency staff that are part of that work group are Director Trujillo, Julie Lies, Tribal Liaison and Brian Considine, Legal and Legislative Manager and Lori Boyd, Contracts Specialist. The group discussed what information was needed and the short turnaround time for the study. Senator **Conway** asked Director Trujillo if the work group discussed the deliverables of the contract. Director Trujillo responded the work group had not discussed the deliverables, just the statuary language. Senator Conway shared his concerns with the Commissioners that he is trying to clearly understand the motivation behind problem gambling study, and to his recollection the commission last visited problem gaming in 2004 or 2005. And lastly, he says that Washington has seen a vast change in the gaming industry since that time. Senator Conway says that he thinks it's appropriate to review the resources that we're using and whether we should be putting more resources into problem gaming in this state. He also reiterated that as the Gambling Commission develops this list of deliverables, recognizing that some of deadlines for producing studies for the legislature are subject to the demands of the study as well. And, he knows that most of the agencies, when the legislature directs a person to do a study, expects to have it done by the time frames that the legislature lays out in the law. **Director Trujillo** continued his report by introducing the agenda for the Strategic planning process for the next day. He said the last strategic plan was crafted in 2014 and will sunset in late 2018. **Deputy Director Amy Hunter** shared the Business Initiative handout to the Commissioners and explain it in detail.

2018 Legislative Wrap-up

Legal and Legislative Manager Brian Considine presented the legislative materials. Mr. Considine reported that this is the time to be thinking of agency request legislation. He will be coming to the June Commission meeting to collect commissioner's ideas. He went over the problem gambling task force and self-exclusion bill that was before the Commissioners earlier this year. Commissioner Patterson asked Senator Conway he was considering the idea of a problem gambling workshop in the Senate. She explained that she was a part of a very successful workshop in the House. Senator Conway mentioned talking to the Chair about that topic and he knows of several meetings of the Senate Commerce and Labor Committee. He brought the idea up about doing something like they did in the House as well. So we'll just have to wait and see on that one. Mr. Considine reminded Commissioners of his plans to meet with Senator Kieser and Senate staff regarding sports betting.

Staff Request for Rule Change/Fee Simplification (Package #5)

Deputy Director Amy Hunter presented the materials for discussion only for Tab 4. This package is the fifth package brought forward to simplify the Commission's licensing fee structure. Specifically, this package amended language activity reporting requirements and added that they submit a quarterly license report for each quarter they hold a license even if they have paid their annual maximum license fee. This package is up for final action to be taken at the May special meeting.

Public Comment: There was no public comment.

Tab 5

Petition for New Rules/Pre-Shuffled Cards

Deputy Director Amy Hunter presented the materials for discussion only for Tab 5. Petitioner John McNutt requested a rule change to allow pre-shuffled cards to be used in the card game mini-baccarat. Staff requested additional rule changes to ensure the integrity of the pre-shuffled card manufacturing process. Mr. McNutt narrated a short video explaining the process. This petition is up for final action at the May special meeting. **Chair Sizemore** asked about the card usage and if the cards would be used for multiple games. **Mr. John McNutt** explained that the cards are only used one time then discarded.

Public Comment: There was no public comment.

Soft Count Demonstration

Petitioner Stacy Hess, from Great American Casino, presented a video to the Commissioners demonstrating the soft count procedures. She is asking the commissioners to approve a rule change that would require two (2) employees instead of three (3) if an automatic bill counter is used in the cage.

Public Session Call to Order

Director Trujillo called the meeting to order at 10:04 am. **Chair Sizemore** asked Legal and Legislative Manager, Brian Considine to call a roll call of Commissioners on the phone. After establishing a quorum Chair Sizemore resumed the meeting.

Chair Sizemore asked for a moment of silence for those fallen law enforcement officer that were lost since the last meeting.

There were 2 people in attendance (excluding staff) and a few on the phone.

Tab 1

Up for Final Action - Petition for New Rules/Pre-Shuffled Cards

Legal and Legislative Manager Brian Considine presented the materials for Tab 1 and said petitioner Mr. McNutt requested a rule change to allow for pre-shuffled cards to be used in the card game mini-baccarat. Staff requested additional language changes that addressed the integrity of the manufacturing process. Staff reviewed pre-shuffled card regulations from 16 U.S. or Canadian jurisdictions and worked with stakeholders since May 2017. In addition:

- June 8, 2017: Notice of Rule Making was sent to HBCR and Manufacturer licensees;
- July 12, 2017: Stakeholder Meeting was held at Lacey office with call-in feature. Nineteen people participated in the meeting and card manufacturers agreed to submit information to facilitate writing rules and internal controls;
- Jan. 29, 2018: Email was sent to stakeholder workgroup with draft rules and internal controls; and

• Feb 8, 2018: Stakeholder meeting was held at Lacey office with call-in feature. Nine people participated in the meeting and all agreed with staff proposed rule changes.

There was no additional discussion by Commissioners or public comment.

Commissioner Patterson made a motion to file the rule change(s) as presented by staff with an effective date of July 1, 2018.

Commissioner Stearns seconded the Motion.

Legal and Legislative Manager Brian Considine called for a verbal vote of Commissioners. The Motion passed. 5:0

Tab 2

Up for Final Action - Staff Request for Rule Change/Fee Simplification (Package #5)
Legal and Legislative Manager Brian Considine presented the materials for Tab 2. This is the fifth rules package staff will bring forward to make changes to the Commission's licensing fee structure. The fifth rules package covers two items. They are: 1) Licensees must report their gross gambling receipts on their quarterly license reports and submit a quarterly license report for each quarter they hold a license even if they have paid their annual maximum license fee; and 2) A fee is added back for Linked Bingo Prize Providers – oversight by not originally including it in the fee schedule in package #1.

There was no additional discussion by Commissioners or public comment.

Commissioner Patterson made a motion to file Fee Simplification package #5 as presented by staff with an effective date of 31 days after filing.

Legal and Legislative Manager Brian Considine called for a verbal vote of Commissioners. Commissioner Levy seconded the Motion.

The Motion passed. 5:0

Before the meeting adjourned, Chairman Sizemore asked if there was any public comment. There was none.

The Commission meeting adjourned at 10:17 a.m.

NEWS

Re-accreditation:

On May 23, 2018, we were awarded re-accreditation by the WA Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs (WASPC). We were first accredited in 2014. The current accreditation program is overseen by WASPC's Professional Services Committee, Accreditation Commission and the Board of Directors. We are one of 55 accredited agencies in our state of the approximately 260 law enforcement agencies in WA. Maintaining accreditation is a significant achievement. We choose to voluntarily undergo this process so that we receive third party scrutiny and can demonstrate to the public we are operating under industry best practices.

Sports Betting:

The recent Supreme Court of the United States decision to strike down the federal sports betting prohibition has us looking at next steps. As Gambling Commissioners and WA lawmakers determine potential impacts, we will be there to provide answers. Presently, many states are looking to determine steps they must take to legalize sports betting. Some are pre-positioned to enact draft regulations and some are looking at what regulatory framework is needed for their particular state. As many as 15-18 states are considering some form of sports betting legalization. All are watching to see if the federal government enacts an all-encompassing concept that tries to mitigate the impacts of a state-by-state regulatory approach. I had the opportunity to appear on TVW's The Impact to discuss this subject https://www.tvw.org/watch/?eventID=2018051060. Legal and Legislative Manager, Brian Considine will touch on this subject today with more indepth discussion in July.

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UPDATES:

Fee Structure Simplification Project:

While the work of passing the fee simplification rules has occurred, Staff continues to focus on the projects that will ensure implementation and bring this substantial change to life. Eight teams have been put together to accomplish multiple sub-projects. Twenty-one sub-projects have been initiated with an additional six scheduled to begin in June or the months thereafter. Three sub-projects have been completed which means that in addition to staff's normal course of duties, they are in the midst of working through eighteen sub-projects. These sub-projects include but are not limited to updating 1) internal and external communication and education materials; 2) system programming; 3) regulatory programs; 4) regulatory records; 5) internal business processes; 6) reporting standards; 7) forms; 8) internal auditing procedures; and 9) "My Account."

Problem Gambling:

ESSB 6032 called for the state to provide \$50,000 to the Gambling Commission once the Gambling Commission secured matching funds to fund a study to analyze the scope of services available for pathological or problem gamblers and their families in the state. We provided the matching funds. A kick off meeting was held early April. In a subsequent meeting, a small group determined that it was best for us to enter into an interagency agreement with an institution of higher education that has experience with conducting such studies. We are looking at University of Washington and Washington State University. We are also doing our very best to keep problem gambling stakeholders informed and that includes Tribes through the Washington Indian Gaming Association (WIGA). Our timeline is:

Strategic Planning:

Last month we had a very successful Strategic Planning work session. Please recall day two of our April Commission meeting was dedicated to this purpose. We have taken the results of that works session and are in the middle of writing them into our first iteration of an overarching Strategic Plan estimated to cover the next 4-5 years. It is our plan to have a draft plan for your consideration at the July Commission meeting.

In Closing, I'd like to formally thank Rebecca Kaldor, Executive Director of WIGA for allowing us the opportunity to be a part of several of the breakout sessions at the upcoming Northwest Indian Gaming Conference & Expo that will be held this year at the Little Creek Casino Resort June 19-20, 2018.

Final Order – June 7, 2018 Commission Meeting

Mr. Giovanni Gonzalez has a gambling certification authorizing Class III Employee activity at Emerald Queen Casino in Tacoma, Washington, which is operated by the Puyallup Tribe of Indians. His certification expires on July 19, 2018.

On July 7, 2017, while employed and working as a security officer at Emerald Queen Casino, Mr. Gonzalez is alleged to have sexually assaulted a female patron.

Based on the above allegation, the Puyallup Tribal Gaming Regulatory Office revoked Mr. Gonzalez's tribal gaming license on October 10, 2017. Mr. Gonzalez did not contest the revocation, and did not disclose the above allegations or revocation of his tribal gaming license to the gambling commission. Mr. Gonzalez's case has been referred to the Pierce County Prosecutor's Office for criminal charges, but no criminal charges have yet been filed.

Director Trujillo issued a Notice of Administrative Charges on February 21, 2018. The Charges were sent to Mr. Gonzalez by regular and certified mail to the last address the Gambling Commission had on file on March 1, 2018. The regular mail was returned on March 10, 2018, and the certified mail was returned on March 20, 2018. It was noticed by staff at that time that there was a clerical error in the address and the charges were re-issued on March 20, 2018 at the corrected address. The certified mail was returned on March 25, 2018 as "Return to Sender, Not Deliverable as Addressed, Unable to Forward." The regular mail was not returned. As of the date of this memo, the Commission has not received any response from Mr. Gonzalez.

Mr. Gonzalez's failure to respond to the charges or request a hearing is a waiver of Mr. Gonzalez's right to a hearing in Case No. CR 2017-01457. You may take final action against his gambling certification. Based on his conduct, Mr. Gonzalez cannot show by clear and convincing evidence that he is qualified to keep his gambling certification. Therefore, staff recommends that the Commission sign the proposed final order and revoke Giovanni Gonzalez's Class III Employee certification, Number 69-38515.

Final Order – June 7, 2018 Commission Meeting

Mr. Juan A. Vazquez Gonzalez has a gambling certification authorizing Class III Employee activity at Northern Quest Casino in Airway Heights, Washington, which is operated by the Kalispel Tribe of Indians. His certification expired on April 5, 2018.

On November 7, 2017, Mr. Vazquez Gonzalez was charged in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Washington in Case Number 2:17-mj-00447-JTR with one count of Attempted Enticement of a Minor to Engage in Illegal Sexual Activity and one count of Attempted Child Sex Trafficking. The charges stem from allegations that Mr. Vazquez Gonzalez attempted, via the internet, to induce a 13-year-old girl to engage in sexual activity. The 13-year-old girl was in fact an undercover law enforcement officer.

Based on Mr. Vazquez Gonzalez's disclosure of the charges, the Kalispel Tribal Gaming Agency revoked Mr. Vazquez Gonzalez's tribal gaming license on November 1, 2017.

Director Trujillo issued a Notice of Administrative Charges on January 12, 2018. The Charges were sent to Mr. Vazquez Gonzalez by regular and certified mail to the last address the Gambling Commission had on file on January 16, 2018. The Gambling Commission received a hearing request from Mr. Vazquez Gonzalez on January 29, 2018. A prehearing conference was scheduled for April 24, 2018, and Mr. Vazquez was mailed notice of the hearing on April 5, 2018. Further, Gambling Commission staff spoke on the phone with Mr. Vazquez Gonzalez on April 23, 2018 and confirmed he was aware of the prehearing set the next day. Mr. Vazquez Gonzalez failed to appear at the prehearing conference on April 24, 2018, and an order dismissing appeal was issued on Thursday, April 26, 2018, to Mr. Vazquez Gonzalez at the last address the gambling Commission had on file. As of the date of this memo, the Commission has not received any further communication from Mr. Gonzalez.

Mr. Vazquez Gonzalez's failure to attend or participate in a hearing or other stage of an adjudicative proceeding is a waiver of Mr. Vazquez Gonzalez's right to a hearing in Case No. CR

2017-01685. You may take final action against his gambling certification. Based on his conduct, Mr. Vazquez Gonzalez cannot show by clear and convincing evidence that he is qualified to keep his gambling certification. Therefore, staff recommends that the Commission sign the proposed final order and revoke Juan A. Vazquez Gonzalez's Class III Employee certification, Number 69-42145.

Final Order – June 7, 2018 Commission Meeting

Mr. Wayne B. Miller had a gambling license authorizing Public Card Room Employee activity at Great American Casino in Tukwila, Washington. His license expired on April 18, 2018.

On or about June 6, 2017, Mr. Miller is alleged to have knowingly possessed depictions of minors engaged in sexually explicit conduct.

Based on the above allegations, on June 9, 2017, Mr. Miller was charged in King County Superior Court Case No. 17-1-05196-1 with one count of Possession of Depictions of a Minor Engaged in Sexually Explicit Conduct in the First Degree, a Class B Felony. On March 8, 2018, an Amended Information was filed against Mr. Miller, charging one count of Attempted Possession of Depictions of a Minor Engaged in Sexually Explicit Conduct in the Second Degree, a gross misdemeanor. On March 8, 2018, Mr. Miller pleaded guilty to the amended charge. Mr. Miller failed to report the charge to the Gambling Commission until he completed his renewal application on March 14, 2018. On April 13, 2018, he was sentenced to 24 months unsupervised probation with 364 days jail suspended.

Director Trujillo issued a Summary Suspension and Notice of Administrative Charges which were personally served on Mr. Miller on April 4, 2018. As of the date of this memo, the Commission has not received any response from Mr. Miller.

Mr. Miller's failure to respond to the charges or request a hearing is a waiver of Mr. Miller's right to a hearing in Case No. CR 2018-00468. You may take final action against his gambling license. Based on his conduct, Mr. Miller cannot show by clear and convincing evidence that he is qualified to keep his gambling license. Therefore, staff recommends that the Commission sign the proposed final order and revoke Wayne B. Miller's gambling license, License Number 68-13970.

SUBJECT: Murphy v. NCAA, et al. and Sports Gambling Update

The U.S. Supreme Court issued a 6-3 decision in *Murphy v. NCAA*, *et al.* (named after New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy, who inherited the lawsuit from his predecessor, Chris Christie) on May 14, 2018. The Supreme Court found that the Professional and Amateur Sports Protection Act (PASPA) is unconstitutional because it violates the 10th Amendment. The 10th Amendment provides that, if the Constitution does not either give a power to the federal government or take that power away from the states, that power is reserved for the states or the people themselves. The Supreme Court has long interpreted this provision to bar the federal government from "commandeering" the states to enforce federal laws or policies.

Consequently, the Supreme Court ruled that PASPA's prohibition on states' legalization of sports betting violates the anti-commandeering doctrine and PASPA is void. Congress can regulate sports gambling directly, and can pass a federal law prohibiting or regulating sports betting. However, it cannot direct states to enforce the Federal Government's decisions. This decision allows each state to regulate sports betting on its own.

Currently, sports boards in RCW 9.46.0335 (attached) is the only sports betting authorized in the Gambling Act. Our state constitution, Article 2, Section 24 requires that any new forms of sports gambling pass by a 60 percent vote of the Legislature or 60 percent vote of the people if submitted by referendum or initiative. Until then, any sports gambling other than sports boards is illegal and cannot be allowed in the state.

Deputy Director Amy Hunter, Agent in Charge Jennifer LaMont, Public Information Office Heather Songer, and myself attended sports betting seminars at the UNLV's International Center for Gaming Regulation in March and April in anticipation of this decision. Staff is prepared to discuss with you the sports betting regulatory and policy considerations should the Legislature decide to authorize and regulate new forms of sports betting, and I will present a more thorough introduction and overview of sports betting at our July Commission Meeting.

The agency also is preparing information and materials for the Legislature to assist them in their analysis of the many policy issues that will be considered as they determine how to proceed on sports betting legislation.

However, there has been a flurry of activity across the country since the decision and several states are preparing to offer regulated sports betting in the next few weeks. Below is a summary of this issue across the U.S. in preparation for our sports betting presentation at our July Commission meeting.

Congress

As stated above, Congress could intervene and act on sports betting. It is highly unlikely Congress would prohibit sports betting in the U.S., and I'll focus on possible federal sports betting regulations.

In May 2017, the Gaming Accountability and Modernization Enhancement (GAME) Act was introduced in Congress by Rep. Pallone (D-New Jersey). It repealed PASPA and allowed for sports betting under federal law if it is authorized in the state where the sports betting occurs. It establishes some minimum consumer protections and authorizes the Secretary of Health and Human Services to implement programs for the prevention and treatment of gambling addiction. PASPA is now unconstitutional, but the GAME Act could be a foundation for new federal legislation if Congress believes the federal government should be involved in sports gambling.

Additionally, Senator Orrin Hatch (R-Utah) has publicly stated that he will introduce new sports betting legislation. Senator Hatch is an original sponsor of PASPA and believes there must be federal standards to ensure the integrity of sports. He believes there are important interstate commerce issues to address and has stated that "we cannot allow [sports betting] to proliferate amid uneven enforcement and a patchwork race to the regulatory bottom." Senator Hatch is retiring when his term ends at the end of 2018 and I expect he will have an uphill climb to see his proposed legislation become law before his term ends.

Sports Leagues

Professional sports leagues (NBA, NFL, NHL, MLB) and the NCAA anticipated this result and are promoting a federal framework that provides a uniform approach to sports gambling in states that choose to permit it. However, they are also actively lobbying state legislatures for certain league-friendly policies before PASPA was ruled unconstitutional.

The leagues' priority has been to promote policies that they believe will ensure the integrity of their games remains intact. They're asking state legislatures to allow them the right to control who provides sports betting data and that sportsbook operators pay the leagues an "integrity fee." State legislatures have had a mixed reaction to these requests, and the gambling industry has strongly opposed both ideas. However, these are policy considerations being raised in every state currently looking to authorize and regulate sports betting.

State Regulators

Currently, Delaware, Mississippi, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, and West Virginia are working to be the first states outside of Nevada to offer and regulate sports betting within their state borders. The majority of these states are looking to license and regulate

commercial operators, and their gaming commissions are currently finalizing the state regulations. Each regulatory structure is state-specific, but many regulatory structures allow both land-based and internet sports betting. Delaware and Rhode Island will have their state lotteries run operations, and Delaware announced they will begin accepting single-wager sports betting at the three in-state race track casinos on June 5, 2018.

Additionally, four state gaming commissions—Nevada, Massachusetts, Michigan, and Louisiana—issued a statement (attached) recently. These states urge all regulators and legislatures to support a "rational, state-based and tribal government approach" to sports betting and identified five guiding principles for state legislatures to consider in order to promote a "coherent regulatory environment." These guidelines promote coordinated interstate effort to: stop illegal bookmaking; share real-time betting information; adopt responsible gambling policies; enact reasonable tax rates to ensure customers transfer from the black market to the regulated market; and to trust the expertise of regulators to ensure the integrity of sports betting and not take away tax revenues by imposing "integrity fees." These state regulators have committed to these principles and invite other state regulators to join with them in supporting the implementation of these guidelines.

Tribal Governments

The National Indian Gaming Association (NIGA) adopted a resolution (attached) in support of legalized sports betting. The resolution sets out nine principles NIGA believes must be considered for any new sports betting legislation, including: Tribal Government sports betting revenues will not be subject to taxation; customers may access Tribal Government sports betting sites as long as Sports Betting is legal where the customer is located; Tribal rights under the IGRA and existing Tribal-State gaming compacts must be protected; and any consideration of the use of mobile, on-line or internet gaming must adhere to the principles listed in the resolution.

California, Connecticut, Iowa, Minnesota, New York, Oklahoma, and Oregon are some states with Tribal gaming operations that we are monitoring. Each of these states must navigate their current tribal compacts should they allow sports betting. New York and Connecticut might be the first two states to reach an agreement, but these states' government-to-government conversations are on-going to determine the viability and availability of sports betting operations in the state and at Tribal gaming facilities.

Commercial Operators

Commercial gambling operators have been very active preparing to enter new regulated markets. William Hill is the largest sports book operator in Nevada and one of the largest operators in the United Kingdom (U.K.). It runs Delaware Lottery's sports betting operations and has partnered with Monmouth Park horse race track to open a sports book at the track with a tentative opening of June 8, 2018. It also has signed an agreement with at least one Atlantic City casino, and is expected to be aggressive in entering additional casinos and U.S. sports betting markets.

DraftKings is the daily fantasy sports company that attempted to legal fantasy sports betting in Washington State during the 2015-16 legislative sessions. It launched DraftKings Sportsbook and has started advertising in New Jersey and recently came to an agreement to run one Atlantic

City casino sports betting operations. Its customer base and name recognition should allow it to enter additional casinos and markets where sports betting is authorized.

Paddy Power Betfair is one of the largest sports book operators in the U.K., along with William Hill, and it operates an online casino in New Jersey. It announced last week that it purchased the majority ownership of popular daily fantasy sports company FanDuel. Paddy Power Betfair looks to have purchased FanDuel because of its strong brand and large customer base to allow to better enter the U.S. sports betting market. Paddy Power Betfair is expected to be aggressive in the U.S. sports betting market based on its large presence in the U.K.

International Gaming Technology (IGT) is a licensed gambling manufacturer that provides TLS products to Washington Tribes and provides services to many state lotteries. It also has sports book operations in Italy and currently operates all mobile sports betting at MGM resorts in Nevada. It is expected that IGT's sports betting mobile platform will spread to additional MGM properties where sports betting is authorized. IGT also is the sole bidder to operate Rhode Island Lottery's sports betting operation.

Lastly, Scientific Games, Inc. is a licensed gambling manufacturer that provides products to Washington Tribes and commercial operators. Last fall, Scientific Games purchased NYX Gaming Group and its sports betting platform in anticipation of a new U.S. sports betting market. Scientific Games launched its new sports betting platform in April 2018 and is currently seeking certification in New Jersey.

RCW 9.46.0335

Sports pools authorized.

The legislature hereby authorizes any person, association, or organization to conduct sports pools without a license to do so from the commission but only when the outcome of which is dependent upon the score, or scores, of a certain athletic contest and which is conducted only in the following manner:

- (1) A board or piece of paper is divided into one hundred equal squares, each of which constitutes a chance to win in the sports pool and each of which is offered directly to prospective contestants at one dollar or less;
- (2) The purchaser of each chance or square signs his or her name on the face of each square or chance he or she purchases; and
- (3) At some time not later than prior to the start of the subject athletic contest the pool is closed and no further chances in the pool are sold;
- (4) After the pool is closed a prospective score is assigned by random drawing to each square;
- (5) All money paid by entrants to enter the pool less taxes is paid out as the prize or prizes to those persons holding squares assigned the winning score or scores from the subject athletic contest;
- (6) The sports pool board is available for inspection by any person purchasing a chance thereon, the commission, or by any law enforcement agency upon demand at all times prior to the payment of the prize;
- (7) The person or organization conducting the pool is conducting no other sports pool on the same athletic event; and
- (8) The sports pool conforms to any rules and regulations of the commission applicable thereto.

STATE GAMBLING REGULATORS EQUIPPED AND READY TO TAKE CHARGE ON LEGAL SPORTS BETTING INDUSTRY

This statement is issued by gaming regulatory leaders from four state gambling jurisdictions in response to the recent U.S. Supreme Court ruling to confirm and assert that states and tribal gaming regulatory agencies have the capacity, resources, and ability to oversee the regulation of legalized sports betting. Sports betting in Nevada has already been regulated with integrity and success, and gaming jurisdictions across the United States, including tribal jurisdictions, have demonstrated their ability to oversee gaming of all sorts while adhering to the highest standards.

Since the opinion in *Murphy v. National Collegiate Athletic Association* was released last week, there has been an overwhelming response by the various interested parties, including states, leagues, federal congressional representatives, responsible gambling organizations, sports betting consumers, and gambling industry operators and affiliates. As we expect the dialogue to continue with substantial actions to be undertaken rapidly, it is important to assert and confirm our support for a rational, state-based and tribal government approach to an expansion of legal, regulated sports wagering in the United States.

For nearly two years, leading regulators from key state commercial gambling jurisdictions have been meeting under the auspices of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas's International Center for Gaming Regulation (ICGR), to dialogue about current issues affecting the gambling industry and to further best regulatory practices.

As experienced gaming regulators who are part of the U.S. State Gaming Regulators Forum, we would encourage jurisdictions to establish and implement regulatory models that are not only adaptive and successful, but that remain flexible enough to be sturdy, yet encourage innovation.

This group looks forward to continuing to collaborate together while serving as a resource as the various states and tribal governments begin implementing sports betting in their jurisdictions. Nevada, having both the depth and experience with legalized, regulated sports wagering, serves as a leader to help guide us and other jurisdictions through this historical time.

As the regulators in different gambling jurisdictions, we have jointly concluded that the following simple guidelines will help with an initial approach to sports betting regulation. While we cannot personally commit our respective jurisdictions to any specific position or practice, we support all of these positions individually, will support them throughout our regulatory agencies, and will help provide guidance to other jurisdictions as to how these guidelines can be implemented.

- 1. Coordinated action among jurisdictions offering sports betting against illegal bookmaking, illegal gambling activities, and any unsuitable and unlawful associations, along with strong support from federal-level enforcement agencies, is the best way to eradicate illegal activities.
- 2. Another critical element of legalized sports betting is the establishment of structures and processes that will ensure a high level of integrity in all sports. Therefore, all of our jurisdictions and others that legalize and regulate sports wagering should aim to share real-time betting information, in an effort to detect, prevent, and eliminate match fixing.

- 3. Measures for responsible gambling in sports betting are important to help protect and maintain the credibility of the activity.
- 4. The history of legalized sports betting in both Nevada and the United Kingdom indicates that it is a very low-margin business compared to other forms of gambling. Reasonable tax rates and fees are essential for legal sports betting to be competitive until illegal providers can be eradicated.
- 5. Additional fees, including the so-called "integrity fee," increase the costs of legal sports betting, siphon much needed tax revenues away from state coffers, and increase state regulatory burdens.

We encourage state legislatures that elect to legalize sports betting to consider these guidelines in order to promote a coherent regulatory environment.

We, as members of the U.S. State Gaming Regulators Forum, will look to immediately develop a Memorandum of Understanding between our jurisdictions to acknowledge support for implementation of these principles. We welcome other jurisdictions' regulatory bodies sharing these values to join with us.

NATIONAL INDIAN GAMING ASSOCIATION RESOLUTION

01-LAS-BOD-4-16-18

TITLE: To Support a repeal of the Professional and Amateur Sports Protection Act (PASPA) or Sports Betting Legislation that Fully Recognizes and Protects Indian Gaming Operations and that satisfies the NIGA Principles of Sovereignty for Any Repeal of PASPA or Sports Betting Legislation

WHEREAS, the National Indian Gaming Association (NIGA) is an intertribal association of 184 federally recognized Indian Tribes established to support Indian gaming and defend Indian sovereignty; and

WHEREAS, Indian Tribes are sovereigns that pre-date the United States, with prior and treaty protected rights to self-government and to our Indian lands, and

WHEREAS, the Constitution of the United States, through the Treaty, Commerce, and Apportionment Clauses and the 14th Amendment, recognizes the sovereign status of Indian Tribes as Native nations established prior to the United States; and

WHEREAS, before the United States, Indian nations were independent sovereigns with complete authority over our lands and our citizens; and

WHEREAS, in California v. Cabazon (1987), the Supreme Court reaffirmed the inherent right of Indian Tribes to conduct Indian gaming as an essential element of Tribal self-government, free from state interference; and

WHEREAS, in 1988, Congress enacted the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act (IGRA) to affirm the inherent authority of Tribal Governments to conduct Indian gaming, strengthen Tribal Governments, and foster tribal economic self-sufficiency; and

WHEREAS, Congress is considering a proposal to alter federal laws with regard to Sports Betting; and

WHEREAS, in 2018, the U.S. Supreme Court will rule on the constitutionality of PASPA, and the outcome of which could potentially determine the legal landscape of Sports Betting for Tribal and State Government; and

WHEREAS, several State legislatures have been considering proposals to legalize various forms of Sports Betting; and

WHEREAS, Indian country has diverse economies that could be impacted by the federal or state legalization of Sports Betting, and, therefore, should be consulted during all phases of the legislative process; and

WHEREAS, NIGA has adopted principles that it requests Congress to adhere to so as to minimize the negative impacts of Sports Betting on tribal casinos, and which would permit tribes to conduct Sports Betting similar to what could be authorized for others to conduct off-reservation; and

WHEREAS, the principles that must be included in any proposed legislation are:

- Tribes must be acknowledged as governments with authority to regulate gaming
- Tribal Government Sports Betting revenues will not be subject to taxation
- Customers may access Tribal Government Sports Betting sites as long as Sports Betting is legal where the customer is located
- Tribal rights under the IGRA and existing Tribal-State gaming compacts must be protected
- IGRA should not be opened up for amendments
- Tribal Governments must receive a positive economic benefit in any federal Sports Betting legalization proposals
- Indian Tribes possess the inherent right to opt in to a federal regulatory scheme to ensure broad-based access to markets
- Tribal Governments acknowledge the integrity and protection of the game and patron protections for responsible gaming are of the utmost importance
- Any consideration of the use of mobile, on-line or internet gaming must adhere to these principles

WHEREAS, if the above principles are reflected in any repeal of the PASPA or legislation amending PASPA, and such repeal or amendment does not contain any otherwise detrimental clauses, NIGA can support such legislation; and

WHEREAS, NIGA adopted Resolution #01-SEM-11-02-15, TITLED: To Support Only Internet Gaming Legislation that Fully Recognizes and Protects Indian Gaming Operations under the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act and that Satisfies the NIGA Principles of Sovereignty for Any Internet Gaming Legislation,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, NIGA hereby supports only federal and state legislation involving Sports Betting that includes the above principles and does not otherwise include any detrimental clauses; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall be the policy of NIGA until it is withdrawn or modified by subsequent resolution.
