Thank you for requesting approval to market the card game "Push Your Luck Blackjack" to Washington State commercial card rooms and Tribal casinos. Based on our review of the documentation we received from American Gaming Systems, LLC, the Washington State Gambling Commission will approve the game under the conditions listed below:

#### Commercial Card Rooms

- The game shall be played and operated under the terms and conditions set forth under the "Push Your Luck Blackjack Rules of Play" you provided and are enclosed.
- Commercial card room operators seeking to operate this game must first submit their internal controls and receive approval from the Commission prior to implementing.
- Manufacturers and distributors of graphic layouts and/or any other equipment associated with the game must be licensed by the state prior to the sale of the equipment.

### **Tribal Casinos**

- The game shall be played and operated under the terms and conditions set forth under the "Push Your Luck Blackjack – Rules of Play" you provided and are enclosed.
- Each Tribal Gaming Operation must request and obtain approval from their respective Tribal Gaming Agencies (TGA).
- Before TGA allows your game to operate, they will seek concurrence from our agency as well.

- In addition to your approved rules, the Tribal submission to us must include all supplemental information required by Tribal-State Compact Appendix A, Section 18.
- Manufacturers and distributors of graphic layouts and/or any other equipment associated with the game must be certified by the state and licensed by the Tribe prior to the sale of the equipment.

Please be advised that the Financial Investigations Unit is currently reviewing your game application for any new substantial interest holders, as defined by WAC 230-03-045, related to this game and may be contacting you.

Furthermore, any modifications to this game may affect this approval. Contact the Commission should you contemplate modifications. # PUSH YOUR LUCK BLACKJACK BONUS WAGER RULES AND DEALING PROCEDURES

Push Your Luck is standard house-banked blackjack but with an optional bonus wager. All rules pertaining to blackjack as posted on the WSGC's website remain the same except as listed in these rules of play.

A round of Push Your Luck Blackjack begins with each player placing two (2) separate bets on the table, (1) on the Push Your Luck bonus wager circle or logo directly in front of the player (note: this bet is optional) and (2) in the main Blackjack wager circle directly in front of the player (this bet is mandatory, See Table Game Layout).

The player may wager any amount up to half of the main Blackjack wager on the Push Your Luck bonus wager. Therefore, the Push Your Luck bonus wager amount cannot exceed half of the main Blackjack wager.

Once the above two wagers are placed, the dealer will deal standard Blackjack as per house rules. In the event the Player and Dealer push at the end of the Blackjack hand, the Dealer must pay the Player 10 to 1 on the Push Your Luck bonus wager (if bet) and the main Blackjack wager will push. If at the end of the Blackjack hand, the player's hand does not tie the dealer's hand, all Push Your Luck bonus wagers are lost. If the player's final Blackjack hand is higher than the dealer's hand, then the player will lose the Push Your Luck bonus wager (if bet) but will be paid even money on the Blackjack wager. If the player's final Blackjack hand is lower than the dealer's hand or if the player busts his or her hand, then the player will lose both the Push Your Luck bonus wager and Blackjack wager.

The following rules will also apply to the Push Your Luck bonus wager: Blackjacks can only tie Blackjacks, 21's can only tie 21's, 20's can only tie 20's, 19's can only tie 19's, 18's can only tie 18's, and 17's can only tie 17's, and Bust hands cannot tie. All ties pay 10 to 1 on the Push Your Luck bonus wager.

Operators cannot allow wagering limits to exceed the authorized limits set out in WAC 230-15-040 and WAC 230-15-140.
