We have reviewed the changes made to Wild Monkey Pai Gow. Based on our review of the documentation we received from Masque Publishing Inc. the Washington State Gambling Commission will approve the game under the conditions listed below:

• The game shall be played and operated under the terms and conditions set forth under the Wild Monkey Pai Gow game rules you provided on March 5, 2021 and are enclosed.

Commercial Card Rooms

- Commercial card room operators seeking to operate this game must first submit their internal controls and receive approval from the Commission prior to implementing.
- Manufacturers and distributors of graphic layouts and/or any other equipment associated with the game must be licensed by the state prior to the sale of the equipment.

<u>Tribal Casinos</u>

- Each Tribal Gaming Operation must request and obtain approval from their respective Tribal Gaming Agencies (TGA).
- Before TGA allows your game to operate, they will seek concurrence from our agency as well
- In addition to your approved rules, the Tribal submission to us must include all supplemental information required by Tribal-State Compact Appendix A, Section 18.

RULES OF PLAY

Wild Monkey Pai Gow is a variation of the standard Pai Gow Poker game and may include optional bonus wagers. All rules pertaining to Pai Gow Poker as posted on the WSGC website will remain the same except as noted in these rules of play.

Casino operators choose which of the bonus wagers they will offer. Casino operators establish the minimum and maximum wagering limits and must not allow wagering limits to exceed the authorized limits set out in WAC 230-15-040 and WAC 230-15-140.

1. Wild Monkey Pai Gow is dealt in the same manner as standard Pai Gow Poker, except after all hands have been dealt to the player and dealer positions the dealer will then take the top card off the remaining four undealt cards and add it to the dealer's hand -- so the dealer's hand receives eight cards.

2. Players arrange their two poker hands in the same manner as standard Pai Gow Poker; and then once the player places each hand into its designated area on the table layout, the player may optionally double down the original bet. To double down, the player places a second wager beside the original bet; this double down wager can be any amount up to the amount of the original bet.

3. If the player is dissatisfied with his or her hand, the player may Surrender. This option allows the player to drop out of a hand after seeing the seven cards dealt to him or her. The player forfeits half of the original bet. This decision must be made before the dealer reveals his or her eight cards. The casino determines whether a player's surrendered hand may still qualify for any bonus wager payout.

4. After all players have set their hands, and any double downs or surrenders have been made, the dealer will reveal his or her eight cards and using the best seven of eights cards will set the dealer-hand according to the "house way." The unused eighth card will be set aside and then discarded. If it is revealed that the Joker is one of the eight cards in the dealer's hand, the dealer must automatically discard the Joker and use the remaining seven cards to set the dealer's hand -- so in other words, the dealer's hand is never allowed to use the Joker as a part of setting its two poker hands.

5. Once the dealer's hand is set, player-hands are compared with the dealer's hand and are resolved in the same manner as standard Pai Gow Poker. All winning bets, and any winning double down wagers, are paid even money (1 to 1).

Dealer Joker Bonus Wager

In addition to the standard Pai Gow Poker bet, casinos may offer the Dealer Joker bonus wager. The Dealer Joker bonus wager will win or lose based solely on whether or not the dealer's eight-card hand contains the Joker: the Player wins the Dealer Joker bonus wager if the dealer's eight-card hand does contain the Joker and the Player's hand beats the dealer's hand, then the winning bonus wager is paid according to one of the following pay tables; the Player loses the Dealer Joker bonus wager if the dealer's eight-card hand does not contain the Joker.

Royal Riches Bonus Wager

In addition to the standard Pai Gow Poker bet, casinos may offer the Royal Riches bonus wager. The player wins the Royal Riches bonus wager if the Player's seven-card hand makes any of the winning hands listed in the pay tables in Appendix A. Only the highest winning hand is paid. If the Player's Royal Riches bonus wager equals or exceeds \$5.00, then Envy Bonus payouts are also enabled for certain winning hands, as identified in the pay tables in Appendix A. The Player wins an Envy Bonus payout if another player at the same table achieves a four of a kind or higher. A Player cannot win an Envy Bonus payout based on his or her own hand or based on the dealer's hand.

Dealer Pai Gow Bonus Wager

In addition to the standard Pai Gow Poker bet, casinos may offer the Dealer Pai Gow bonus wager. The player wins the Dealer Pai Gow bonus wager when the dealer's hand contains a "Pai Gow" (that is, a hand that does not contain a pair or better) and the player's hand beats the dealer's hand. The bonus wager is paid according to one of the following payables.

Player Pai Gow Insurance Bonus Wager

In addition to the standard Pai Gow Poker bet, casinos may offer the Player Pai Gow Insurance bonus wager. The player wins the Player Pai Gow Insurance bonus wager when their own hand contains a "Pai Gow" (that is, a hand that does not contain a pair or better). The Ace is always considered high and the Joker is always considered an Ace. The bonus wager is paid according to one of the following payables.

Royal Riches Progressive Jackpot or House Jackpot

In addition to the regular base game wagers and bonus wagers, casinos may offer an optional progressive jackpot wager or house jackpot wager (herein referred to as "Jackpot"). Card Room operators must choose only one of the jackpot configurations.

The Jackpot wager must be played with Masque's Match The Dealer Progressive Table System v005t or higher, as approved by the WSGC. The casino may offer the Jackpot wager on multiple different Masque games, connecting all games to the same progressive jackpot, when card games have the same probability of winning the jackpot prize and the same winning hands (i.e., same pay tables). House jackpots cannot be connected.

1. To begin each round of play players must make the standard Pai Gow Poker bet, they may optionally make a wager on any bonus wagers, and they may also optionally place a single fixed amount wager on an electronically sensed wager spot in order to qualify for the Jackpot wager. The casino determines the amount of the single fixed Jackpot wager, which must be the same amount for all players, and which can be any denomination from \$1 - \$20. The odds-based pay tables increase proportionally with the fixed wager amount.

2. Once all wagers are placed, the dealer initiates the sensing for any Jackpot wager. The electronically sensed wager spot will light up for each spot that has a wager on it. The dealer then removes all Jackpot wagers on any lit electronically sensed wager spot.

3. The dealer then deals out the game, per the casino's dealing procedures.

4. The dealer pays any winning Jackpot wager at the same time as resolving any base game wagers and bonus wagers. The casino determines whether a player's surrendered hand may still qualify for a Jackpot payout.

5. To win a Jackpot payout, the player's best hand from among all seven of the player's cards must achieve one of the qualifying hands listed in the chosen pay table from the pay table options below. All non-percentage Jackpot payouts are made per casino procedures; all percentage-based Jackpot payouts are entered into the Jackpot system using the table control touch pad at the table and paid out per casino procedures.

6. If there are multiple percentage-based jackpot wins in the same round of play, then multiple jackpot awards will be paid. The casino's internal controls will establish the sequence in which multiple awards are paid.

When operated as a house jackpot, the jackpot amount is at the discretion of the casino. Prizes are set by the casino and are required to be displayed at each gaming table. Prizes displayed are considered property of the casino until won by one or more players. The casino must post all required notices and disclosures at each table and follow all rules for house jackpots as defined in the appropriate WAC(s).

When operated as a Progressive, rules for jackpot prizes are contained within WAC 230-15-680 through WAC 230-15-720.
