We have reviewed the changes made to your Emperor's Challenge Exposed game. Based on our review of the documentation we received from Galaxy Gaming, the Washington State Gambling Commission will approve the game under the conditions listed below:

• The game shall be played and operated under the terms and conditions set forth under the Emperor's Challenge Exposed game rules and are enclosed.

Commercial Card Rooms

- Commercial card room operators seeking to operate this game must first submit their internal controls and receive approval from the Commission prior to implementing.
- Manufacturers and distributors of graphic layouts and/or any other equipment associated with the game must be licensed by the state prior to the sale of the equipment.

Tribal Casinos

- Each Tribal Gaming Operation must request and obtain approval from their respective Tribal Gaming Agencies (TGA).
- Before TGA allows your game to operate, they will seek concurrence from our agency as well.

- In addition to your approved rules, the Tribal submission to us must include all supplemental information required by Tribal-State Compact Appendix A, Section 18.
- Manufacturers and distributors of graphic layouts and/or any other equipment
 associated with the game must be certified by the state and licensed by the Tribe
 prior to the sale of the equipment.

Any modifications to this game may affect this approval. If you have any questions on commercial implementation, please contact Brian Lane at (509) 387-7095. If you have any questions on Tribal implementation, please contact Kelly Main at (206) 423-4260.

Game Description

Emperor's Challenge Exposed Pai Gow Poker ("Emperor's Challenge Exposed") is a commission-free, house-banked Pai Gow Poker-based game using a standard 52-card deck and a Joker. The object of the game is for the player to beat the dealer in both their two-card low hand and their five-card high hand. All rules pertaining to standard Pai Gow Poker, stated in the approved rules of play posted on the WSGC website under "Authorized Games", remain the same and are not altered in this game, with the exception of commission-free options and face up dealing procedures. Emperor's Challenge Exposed contains optional bonus wagers that are not dependent on the base game's outcome.

Casino operators choose which bonus wagers they will offer, subject to any restrictions contained within these Rules of Play. Each bonus wager may be made at the player's option and there is no effect on the primary game and no changes in player strategy. Minimum and maximum wagering limits are established by the casino operator in accordance with the limits set in WAC 230-15-040, WAC 230-15-140, or their specific regulatory body.

Rules of Play

- 1. To begin, each player must make an *Emperor's Challenge Exposed Pai Gow* wager. Each player may also place optional *Emperor's Treasure*, *Pai Gow Insurance*, and/or *Jackpot* wagers.
- 2. Each player and the dealer receive seven cards, with the dealer's cards being dealt face up (exposed) and the player's cards dealt face down.
- 3. The dealer sets their five-card high and two-card low hands according to the House Way.
- 4. Each player must then set a two-card low hand and a five-card high hand and place each hand in their designated areas. The ranking of the five-card hand must be higher than the two-card hand. If not, the hand is a foul and settled in accordance with house procedure.
- 5. The dealer examines each player's hand and settles the base game wager as follows:
 - a. **Commission-Free Option #1**: If the dealer has a King-high Pai Gow or less, all player base-game wagers automatically push*.
 - b. Otherwise, standard Pai Gow Poker reconciliation is followed:
 - i. If *both* the player's low-hand and high-hand *are greater* than the dealer's hands, the player's wager is paid 1 to 1.
 - ii. If *one* of the player's hands *is greater* than the dealer's corresponding hand, the player's wager is a push.
 - iii. If *both* the player's hands *are less* than both the dealer's hands, the player's wager loses.

*Alternative Commission-Free Options (Operators choose which one of the three options to offer)

- Commission-Free Option #2: If the dealer has an Ace-high Pai Gow, all player base-game wagers push.
- Commission-Free Option #3: If both the player's low-hand and high-hand are greater than the dealer's hands (i.e., the player wins) and the dealer has any Pai Gow, the player's wager is paid 1 to 2.
- 6. The dealer reconciles all optional wagers.

Equipment

This game will use the Galaxy Gaming owned Andromeda Bonus Jackpot System Series 3d or higher. Jackpot meter displays will not contain additional intelligence or functionality, including but not limited to network capability, wired or wireless.

If operators use an automatic shuffle machine, it must be a WSGC approved model, manufactured by a WSGC licensed manufacturer.

Gambling Promotions

A gambling promotion may be added to any of the bonus wagers at the discretion of the casino operator and with the written consent of Galaxy Gaming.

Optional Bonus Wagers

Pai Gow Insurance (felt)

Players win if their* 7-card hand is a pai gow (does not contain a pair or better). The Ace is always considered high and the joker is always considered an Ace. The wager is paid based on the paytable in Appendix A.

*Alternatively, the player may choose, prior to any cards being dealt, to use the dealer's hand instead of their own hand. If the player chooses this option, the dealer places a designated "Dealer" lammer directly adjacent to the player's *Pai Gow Insurance* wager. Only one Pai Gow Insurance bonus wager may be placed.

Emperor's Treasure (felt)

Players win if their 7-card hand achieves a winning event based on the corresponding paytable in Appendix B. *Emperor's Treasure* may incorporate a bonus feature called *Envy Bonus*.

Envy Bonus

To qualify for an *Envy Bonus* prize, the player must place *an Emperor's Treasure* wager of \$5 or more per hand. A player's hand is awarded an *Envy Bonus* prize when another player's hand, at the same table, achieves a triggering event listed on the corresponding Emperor's Treasure paytable. A player may be permitted to play more than one hand. If a player is playing more than one hand, then one of their hands may be used as the winning triggering event for the other hand. The player's hand that achieves the *Emperor's Treasure* trigger event is not awarded both an *Emperor's Treasure* prize and an *Envy Bonus*. This hand is only awarded the *Emperor's Treasure* prize.

Ace High Pai Gow Insurance

Players win if the dealer's 7-card hand is an Ace-high Pai Gow. The top award is achieved if the player and the dealer both have an Ace-high Pai Gow. Pays are based on the corresponding paytable in Appendix C.

House and Progressive Jackpots

- Operators may choose to offer up to two jackpot game options on a layout using two independent wagering sensors and displaying two independent jackpot amounts
- Each jackpot sensor is considered a separate game
- Progressive Jackpots cannot be linked with House Jackpots
- All jackpots on a table must be of a single jackpot type (House or Progressive)
- Operators can only offer one jackpot game option per sensor

Pai Gow Insurance House or Progressive Jackpot

Players win if their 7-card hand achieves a winning event based on the corresponding paytable in Appendix D. This progressive can be used: as a standalone jackpot, to link jackpots between multiple *Emperor's Challenge Exposed* tables, and to link jackpots between *Emperor's Challenge Exposed Tables* and other approved games that contain the *Pai Gow Insurance House or Progressive Jackpot*.

Note: House Jackpots must operate as standalone jackpots. Conversely, linked jackpots must operate

as Progressive Jackpots.

Emperor's Treasure House or Progressive Jackpot

Players win if their 7-card hand achieves a winning event based on the corresponding paytable in Appendix E. This progressive can be used: as a standalone jackpot, to link jackpots between multiple *Emperor's Challenge Exposed* tables, and to link jackpots between *Emperor's Challenge Exposed Tables* and other approved games that contain the *Emperor's Treasure House or Progressive Jackpot*.

Note: House Jackpots must operate as standalone jackpots. Conversely, linked jackpots must operate as Progressive Jackpots.

House and Progressive Jackpot Definitions

If operated as a **House Jackpot**, the table display does not increment after each wager is placed. All House Jackpot displays must include the following language: "House Jackpot prizes are paid by the casino and are not components of any progressive prize contest. Player wagers do not accrue to any guaranteed player fund. The displayed House Jackpot prize may be modified or discontinued at any time without prior notice."

If operated as a **Progressive Jackpot**, the table display should increment after each wager is placed. Casino operators must follow the rules contained in WAC 230-15-680 through WAC 230-15-720. Prizes displayed are considered to be held in escrow by the casino operator who acts as the custodian of the funds for the benefit of the players. Operators offering progressive jackpots must: (1) Ensure specific wager limits on progressive wagers to ensure all funds are accounted for; and (2) Maintain and account for all funds collected for progressive jackpot games.

The operator's internal controls must define how the Jackpots are configured and how they are won and if operated as a house or a progressive game.
