Purpose of the proposal and its anticipated effects, including any changes in existing rules: The Gambling Commission asked staff to review WAC 230-06-025 (restrictions on firearms as prize) to ensure compliance with all state firearm statutes								
 Reasons supporting proposal: The changes to WAC 230-06-025 seek to accomplish the following: Limit the certificate to be redeemable by a licensed firearm dealer to a Washington State dealer. Limit the firearms that are available as prizes to only those firearms that are authorized for sale in Washington State. Amended language would aim to clarify this point. Prohibit persons who are not permitted to own firearms in Washington from winning a firearm in a raffle. Additional language to the rule was added to ensure such prohibited individuals are not able to acquire a firearm as a raffle prize.
