Dear Mr. Elison,

Thank you for requesting approval of the upgrade to the Dex-S Shuffler. We have completed our review.

The Dex-S Shuffler is approved for use in Washington State. The approval is contingent on the following requirements.

Manufacturer Requirements:

- Ensure the Ethernet, USB, and mini-USB ports are sealed or covered during operation of the shuffler.
- Ensure the Ethernet port on the shuffler is disabled.
- When using a laptop or other specifically authorized external tool to connect to the shuffler ensure compliance with WAC 230-16-151.

Requirements for House-Banked Card Game Licensees:

- Follow manufacturer's recommendation and do not use paper cards.
- Ensure the Ethernet, USB, and mini-USB ports are sealed or covered during operation of the shuffler.
- Calibrate with two decks of 52 cards each.

Tribal Casino Implementation:

• For Tribal Casinos, ensure internal controls are revised to include new equipment and procedures, and approved by Tribal Gaming Agency and concurred with by Washington State Gambling Commission.
