Dear Mr. Kramer,

Thank you for submitting the Elaut Skill Crane amusement game to us for review. Special Agents Karen Rea and Sonja Dolson have completed their review. It is my understanding the game plays as follows:

The object of the Elaut Skill Crane is to move the joystick to position the claw over a prize located inside the game. After the player positions the claw, they press the button to drop the claw over a prize and if successful the prize is picked up and dispensed. The Elaut Skill Crane price per play can be adjusted based on the location and value of the prizes. You were advised that the maximum wager is \$3.50 and maximum prize is \$500 for locations where minors are allowed to play in Washington.

This crane game meets the definition of an amusement game (RCW 9.46.0201) and is approved for use as a Group 7 Crane (WAC 230-13-045) amusement game in Washington State. Licensees operating the Elaut Skill Crane must ensure the game complies with the crane game standards in this rule.

Please be advised that any modifications to the Elaut Skill Crane amusement game software or associated equipment must be provided to us for additional testing and review. In addition, amusement games operated in Washington must not have settings that allow the operator to control the outcome of the game (auto percentaging). The approval of this equipment may be rescinded at any time if problems are found by the Commission or changes to the Washington Administrative Code (WAC) impact this approval. Elaut Skill Crane



Prior to initial power up, the crane and gantry need to have all the shipping wire ties and material removed. Failure to remove the shipping wire ties and materials could result in damage to the machine.

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
