RE: Submission #3101 – Light & Wonder GM Atlas v5 4.0

Dear Ms. Rodriguez,

Thank you for requesting approval of GM Atlas v5 4.0. We have completed our review.

Light & Wonder GM Atlas v5 4.0 (Atlas) is approved for use in Washington State. The approval is contingent on the following requirements.

Manufacturer Requirements:

- Ensure only approved games are used with the system.
- Ensure there is a user login and password set up on the PC table processor prior to startup to limit access to unauthorized users.
- Light & Wonder is allowed to access the system. These functions must be performed by a licensed manufacturer representative onsite at the licensed location. If Light & Wonder intends to use external tools to connect to this equipment, they must comply with WAC 230-16-151.
- Only licensees operating the system shall have access to make changes to the system such as posting and/or choosing pay tables or posting the current jackpot amount.
- Light & Wonder must notify us prior to the first installation in Washington so arrangements may be made for Agent inspection/review. At least 10 business days prior to installation, provide us with a list to include specific locations, dates, and times

when this system will be installed. Send the list to Sonja Dolson at sonja.dolson@wsgc.wa.gov.

Requirements for House-Banked Card Game Licensees:

- Ensure only approved card games, as posted on the WSGC website, are played using Atlas.
- Ensure only approved features are used with the system.
- Ensure only approved equipment is connected to Atlas. Access to all other equipment must be disabled in the network setup menu.
- Ensure all ethernet and USB service ports are sealed while the Atlas is in play and only accessed by authorized personnel.
- Ensure there is a user login and password set up on the PC table processor prior to startup to limit access to unauthorized users.
- Light & Wonder is allowed to access the system. These functions must be performed by a licensed manufacturer representative onsite at the licensed location. If Light & Wonder intends to use external tools to connect to this equipment, they must comply with WAC 230-16-151.
- Only licensees operating the system shall have access to make changes to the system such as posting and/or choosing pay tables or posting the current jackpot amount.
- If the GM Atlas system is used to connect different card games on multiple tables to one progressive jackpot, the system must comply with WAC 230-15-685 and only link games with the same probabilities.
- Ensure primary jackpot cap amounts and procedures for paying out jackpots when multiple jackpots are hit at the same time are included in internal controls.

Tribal Casino Implementation:

- Ensure internal controls are revised to include new equipment and procedures, and approved by the Tribal Gaming Agency and concurred with by the Washington State Gambling Commission.

- Ensure only Tribal casinos operating the system shall have access to the system to make changes such as posting and /or choosing pay tables or posting the current jackpot amount.
- Ensure that wireless services are disabled on any computer connected to the system.
