Chair Sizemore welcomed everyone to the HUB in Lacey. He called the meeting of the Washington State Gambling Commission to order at 11:05 a.m. on November 10, 2016 and immediately went into Executive Session where the Commissioners discussed Pending Investigations, Tribal Negotiations and Litigation.

The public meeting reconvened at 1:10 pm.

The Chair welcomed everyone back to the meeting and introductions were made.

There were about 50 people in attendance.

Director Trujillo introduced the Gambling Commission's newest staff member Heather Songer, Public Information Officer. Heather came to the Gambling Commission from the Pierce County Sheriff's Office where she was the Communications Assistant to Commissioner Ed Troyer, and from the Pierce County Prosecutor's Office as the Public Information Coordinator. Welcome Heather.

The Commissioners presented Senator Hewitt and Representative Hurst with certificates of appreciation for their work with the Commission as ex officio members. Both are retiring from the legislature.

Director's Report:

Director Trujillo presented the materials for Tab 1.

Fee Restructure Work Group Update

Deputy Director Hunter presented the update on the first Fee Restructure Work Group meeting that was held October 24 in SeaTac at the SeaTac Community Center. Chair Sizemore chaired the meeting and Commissioner Patterson also attended. There were about 35 people who attended the meeting and twelve participated by phone. The next meeting will be in Spokane and held at the Hampton Inn by the airport. Representatives who will participate in the Fee Restructure Work Group meetings from large charitable non-profits organizations will be Rick Newgard with Seattle Junior Hockey Association. Representing the paper manufacturers will be Mary Magnuson from North American Fundraising Ticket Manufacturers. Representing the table and game manufacturers will be Tom Doyle from Scientific Games. Representing the distributors will be Wendy Windsor from WOW Distributing. Tribal representation will be Kevin Zenishek from Northern Quest Casino; he will also be representing WIGA. Eric Durban from Muckleshoot Casino will be representing the Washington Association of Gaming

Executives (WAGE). Staff is continuing to do outreach to keep everyone informed of the discussions. Staff is still looking for a representative for amusement game licensees.

Representing the card rooms will be Victor Mena from Recreational Gaming Association and Theresa Malphrus who has a class F card room license. Representing small pull-tab operators will be Janice Carter with Charlie's Restaurant in Puyallup and Monty Harmon will represent Gambling Service Suppliers. Staff will post all representatives along with contact information on the Gambling Commission website.

Senator Conway asked where individuals could find information regarding the fee increases. Ms. Hunter indicated that the Gambling Commission website will be the best place to find that information or they could contact her directly.

Chair Sizemore asked staff to check with the Hampton Inn to arrange shuttle service from the airport.

Chair Sizemore called for public comment.

There was no public comment at this time.

Director Trujillo recognized Representative Hurst and asked him to talk about his bill language that will be introduced at this year's legislative session. Representative Hurst spoke about his views on combining the Washington State Lottery and Washington State Gambling Commission along with Washington State Horse Racing Commission. Representative Hurst is retiring and will not be a Legislator in the upcoming 2017 Legislative Session. Representative Hurst will be passing this bill onto a new Representative. The House Commerce and Gaming Committee will have a work session on December 2, 2016 at 10:00 am in the John L. O'Brien Building.

Tab 2

Economic Market Study on Gaming

Joseph Weinert, Executive Vice President of Spectrum Gaming Group and Adam Steinberg, Senior Vice President, Spectrum Gaming Capital presented the Economic Market Study on Gaming, which included a PowerPoint presentation. The Gambling Commission contracted with Spectrum Gaming, which is an independent research and consulting firm. Spectrum Gaming Group spent five months conducting their research. The focus of the research was on casinos and card rooms, which represent more than 95% of all Washington gambling revenues on a net receipts basis. Currently, most adults in the state live within a two-hour drive to a class III casino.

Director Trujillo stated this report could be located on our website.

Tab 3

G2E 2016 Update

Tom Means presented the materials for Tab 3. Chair Sizemore and Commissioner Troyer, along with Commission staff, attended G2E in September. There were over 26,000 attendees and 450 exhibitors. Every year, staff and Commissioners attend to stay abreast of current and future trends in the gambling industry.

Commissioner Troyer's observation at G2E was that the mature audience was focused on the traditional slot machines whereas the younger audience was focused on virtual reality booths. In some cases, there were lines of 25 people at the demo machines.

Daily Fantasy Sports Update

Special Agents Tyson Wilson and Dan Frey presented the materials for Tab 4. Currently, there are 40 states where Daily Fantasy Sports are operating. Last year, there were 44.

Commissioner Stearns asked about regulation and minimum internal controls. Special Agent Wilson explained that they had third party audits. Commissioner Stearns also asked if any of the 40 states that allow Daily Fantasy Sports address problem gambling. Special Agent Wilson will look into the question and get back to the Commission.

Rule Making Process Overview

Managing Attorney/Legal Liaison Brian Considine presented the materials for Tab 7. Brian gave the Commissioners and audience a brief explanation of the Rules process. The Gambling Commission is currently in the process of hiring a rules coordinator by mid-January.

AMVETS Program Review Post #1

Special Agent Keith Wittmers presented the materials for Tab 5. AMVETS is a fraternal organization of U.S. veterans. It was formed in the 1940's and in 1947, AMVETS became the first World War II organization to be charted by Congress.

Commissioner Gray moved to continue to license AMVETS as a bona fide charitable/nonprofit organization, based on the program review. Commissioner Stearns seconded the motion. The motion passed. 4:0

SUBJECT: LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

The regular 105-day session is scheduled to begin on Monday, January 9, 2017. This is a budget year and our main focus will be our agency request legislation. The Governor's Office approved both requests. We are still looking to secure sponsors for both bills, but I hope to have more information about our sponsors and possible bill numbers at the January Commission Meeting.

Our bill to remove the 15 voting member requirement for charitable and nonprofit organizations to receive a gambling license likely will be submitted to the House Commerce and Gaming and Senate Commerce, Labor, and Sports Committees for initial review. Our bill providing qualified immunity for our special agents should they act to prevent physical injury to a person or substantial property damage regardless of our jurisdiction will likely be submitted to the House Public Safety or Judiciary and Senate Law and Justice Committees.

Additionally, there are several new legislators appointed to the House Commerce and Gaming and Senate Commerce, Labor, and Sports Committees. David Sawyer (D-Parkland) is the new chair and Shelley Kloba (D-Kirkland) is the new vice chair of the House Commerce and Gaming Committee. The other new members of the Committee are: Andrew Barkis (R-Lacey); Jessyn Farrell (D-Seattle); William "Bill" Jenkin (R-Prosser); Cindy Ryu (D-Shoreline); and Jesse Young (R- Gig Harbor). Representatives Condotta, Ranking Minority Member; Vick, Assistant Ranking Minority Member; Blake, and Kirby remain on the Committee.

The Senate Commerce, Labor, and Sports Committee remains mostly the same from last session. Senators Baumgartner and Braun are chair and vice chair, respectively. Senators Keiser, Ranking Minority; Conway; Hasegawa; and King remain on the Committee. Dino Rossi (R-Sammamish); Legislative Memorandum to Commissioners January 2, 2017 Page 2

Rebecca Saldaña, (D-Seattle); and Lynda Wilson (R-Vancouver) are the new Senators on the Committee.

About 71 bills have been pre-filed as of January 2, 2017. Two pre-filed House bills are relevant to the Gambling Commission at this time. One bill amends the criminal statute related to a law enforcement officers use of deadly force. The other bill amends the Gambling Act's seizure and forfeiture statute to only allow forfeiture of personal or real property if a person is convicted of a felony crime. I will provide a full report of any new bills introduced that might impact the Commission at the January Commission Meeting.

Lastly, I will need to check-in with you to ensure that the legislative process we have used for the last several years meets the needs of the Commission. Normally, I only testify on technical aspects of bills at a committee hearing unless you have voted to take a position on a specific bill. I always make it clear you are a part-time Commission and either have chosen to not take a position on a bill or have not met yet to take a position on the bill. Past committees have been very interested in the Commissioners' position on a bill, and bills are usually brought before you for consideration, even if the initial hearing has already passed.

When bills are brought before you, I will make sure to inform you of staff's position in my legislative report, if any. If the Commission supports a bill, staff would typically work with the Chair of the Commission to draft a letter of support for the Committee Chair. The letter would be the basis for a "position statement," which we would post on the agency's website. The Commission would normally take a formal vote if they want to support a bill. Past Commissioners have followed a similar process if the Commission is against a bill or supports the current law instead. If staff recommend a neutral position on a bill, normally there is not a vote.

Staff proposes the above approach this session. The Commissioners can always change this approach as session progresses.

SUBJECT: Fee Restructure Workgroup Update – Report Back after 2nd and 3rd meetings

At the October Commission meeting, the Commissioners asked staff to schedule five workgroup meetings with stakeholders to further discuss creating a new fee structure. The first meeting was held on October 24 in SeaTac; I reported back on the October meeting at your November Commission meeting.

The second meeting was held on November 16 at the Hampton Inn Spokane Airport. There were approximately 25 attendees and 6 participants on the phone; although the call-in feature did not have connection issues, it was still a challenge for participants to hear.

Chair Sizemore said he was hoping the second meeting would be more focused and not necessarily a repeat of the first meeting. He said representatives had been selected for most of the groups now (listed below) and they had the responsibility for coming up with solutions. He reminded the group that the current fee structure does not provide sustainable funding, fees are based on estimates (not actuals), and its roots are in fading forms of gambling. He also said that going forward, representatives should be working toward a consensus from their respective groups. Chair Sizemore suggested that the next meeting be a meeting of the ten representatives and that perhaps it should be located in the commission's main office in Lacey instead of Vancouver, where staff would have easier access to data as questions were asked.

The third meeting was held on November 28 at the Commission's main office in Lacey. There were eleven attendees representing the ten stakeholder groups. A phone-in feature was not offered for this meeting. Chair Sizemore reminded attendees that he and staff have been reviewing the Commission's fee structure since 2014 when the Commission passed an across-the-board six percent fee increase. Each representative was given ample time to discuss their ideas, concerns, and ask questions.

It was agreed the December 5 meeting in the Tri-Cities would be cancelled so there would be more time between meetings for representatives to gather data, contact their group members, and not have to travel so frequently.

As the list of assignments grew and we gained more feedback, it was decided that the fifth meeting, scheduled for December 22 in Everett, would be postponed to allow staff more time to complete the data assignments, and representatives more time to coordinate with their groups. A follow-up meeting has not been scheduled yet and will be set up once all our data has been collected. I anticipate sometime in late January at Chair Sizemore's discretion.

Attached are two letters we received, one from the Upper Skagit Tribe, and the other from the Washington Indian Gaming Association; Director Trujillo responded to both.

Dear Chairman Sizemore, Vice Chair Patterson, Commissioners Gray, Stearns, and Troyer, Director Trujillo and Members of the Work Group:

I write on behalf of the Upper Skagit Indian Tribe, a federally recognized Indian tribe, in response to information being circulated about the Washington State Gambling Commission's ("WSGC") potential restructure of its license fee program. I note first that Upper Skagit is not a member of WIGA and, as a result, has not been consulted with under any definition of the requirements of the Centennial Accord. Notwithstanding that fact, your staff has made certain materials available to Upper Skagit, which materials raise serious issues concerning the relationship between the WSGC and one or more of the federally recognized tribes, including Upper Skagit, subject to the Tribal – State Compacts for Class III gaming.

That portion of the fee restructure that concerns Upper Skagit is the impact on the manufacturers of the video lottery terminals and the certainty that the fee increases proposed by the WSGC will be passed on to the tribes, including Upper Skagit, which have Class III gaming compacts. This is particularly concerning when just one of the manufacturers subject to any fee change has estimated that their cost which will be passed on to tribes will rise from \$4,500 per year to \$650,000 in the first year. When one adds the additional cost to the other manufacturers of video lottery terminals which will be passed on to gaming tribes, the impact on compacted tribes will be substantial.

The above impact raises several potential violations of both federal law and the most recently negotiated cost allocation model applicable to compacted tribes. The issues raised by such a potential WSGC action are as follows:

1. The Indian Gaming Regulatory Act ("IGRA") prohibits states from imposing taxes on gaming tribes. While WSGC wishes to designate the charges on non-Indian gaming enterprises as fees,

the reality is that the pass through to compacted tribes constitutes an illegal tax. This proposed action is reminiscent of the Washington fuel tax assessments challenged by the tribes. In those circumstances, the State imposed a fuel tax on its state licensed distributors with the full knowledge that that assessment would be passed to the end user, the tribes. In two separate lawsuits, the tribes challenged this pass through as an illegal tax on tribes. The State lost this challenge and ultimately settled by entering into compacts with tribes. The proposed fee program restructure is even more suspect because IGRA, under which both the State and the tribes have negotiated, specifically prohibits such a taxing scheme. Under such circumstances, the State cannot ignore the reality of the pass through of its so-called fee restructure. This is all the more true since the WSGC has claimed that this action is revenue neutral and does not increase the WSGC's ability to regulate non-Indian gaming.

- 2. The pass through of the fees to be levied on the manufacturers also clear violates the Upper Skagit (and other compacted tribes) agreement negotiated concerning the cost allocation model as part of the amendment to this Tribe's gaming compact. Upper Skagit and other tribes agreed to a cost allocation that did not include a pass through of fees imposed on the manufacturers. Since the manufacturers only market into the tribally compacted gaming market, the attempt to impose fees which will be passed through to Upper Skagit and other tribes falls under the cost allocation model. Since the WSGC actions are revenue neutral, this clearly means that the fees are intended to shift the cost of operation of the WSGC from the non-Indian regulatory side to the tribal gaming side. This is impermissible under the compacts since the tribes now pay for all the costs of WSGC regulatory action and enforcement and this pass through does not change the level of service imposed by the State under the Compact.
- 3. Finally, will the pass through will adversely impact all compacted tribes, it will particularly damage small and medium sized compacted tribes such as Upper Skagit. Upper Skagit is aware that many of the compacted tribes, including Upper Skagit, have Tribal Gaming Agencies which are professionally the equivalent of the WSGC tribal gaming unit. Allowing for this assessment pass through raises the significant question about the scope of WSGC activity under the compacts, a question which Upper Skagit would not wish to have to address.

Based upon the above, Upper Skagit urges a rejection of that portion of the restructure which adversely impacts the longstanding amicable relationship between the WSGC and the compacted tribes.

I am writing today on behalf of the Washington Indian Gaming Association (WIGA) to express our serious concerns with the Washington State Gambling Commission's (WSGC) fee restructure proposal. I would additionally encourage you to reach out to the non-WIGA tribes to seek their guidance on this very important issue.

As you know, WSGC representatives recently presented the fee restructure proposal at our October WIGA board meeting, and WIGA representatives attended your first fee restructure work group meeting on October 24, 2016. While we generally appreciate this recent outreach, tribes—as sovereign governments, the primary regulators of Indian gaming under the compacts, and pursuant to the Centennial Accord—deserve more than mere stakeholder outreach. As you know, true government to government consultation exists only when the consultation comes in a meaningful way, before a new proposal has already been shaped. WIGA tribes certainly would have appreciated that here, particularly when there is so much at stake.

The WSGC current fee proposal is problematic for several reasons. First, it dramatically increases the fees on manufacturers of video lottery terminals (VLTs), of which tribes are the sole customer. Per your presentation, the current fees for Scientific Games, for example, will increase from \$4,500 annually to \$650,000 annually. This will make Washington the most expensive regulatory jurisdiction in the United States in which Scientific Games operates. When combined with the requirement of crafting VLTs to meet the unique Washington compact requirements and paying more than \$300,000 in annual lab fees, Scientific Games will pass on significant costs of doing business in this State directly to the tribes.

Second, as WSGC contemplates a complete fee overhaul, the tribes cannot help but be concerned that the overall budget, including the fees brought in to the agency, will be subject to change. Considering the way you currently calculate our cost allocation model under our compacts, we expect that factors that go into that model, including the hourly fee, will also be subject to change. Moreover, it appears that to accomplish the WSGC's stated goal of revenue neutrality, the proposal will unilaterally shift the burden from other WSGC functions to the tribes. Third, the effects on tribes are counter to law, our compacts, and our historic relationship with the State of Washington. We would encourage you to review the state taxing prohibition of the Indian Gaming Regulatory Act and federal Indian tax law, generally.

While you may seek to call this proposed assessment a "fee," courts are highly suspect of taxes disguised as fees that are passed through to tribes.

Finally, WIGA feels blindsided by this comprehensive fee restructure when we thought we had put this issue to rest during our 2015 compact negotiations. At those meetings, the WSGC had expressed a serious concern with its shortage of funding and the compact's existing fee calculation model. As a result, WSGC asked—and the tribes agreed as part of the total negotiation—to accept a new cost allocation model to assist the agency in covering any shortfall, even if that shortfall was not directly related to tribal activities. While I cannot speak for all tribes, I can tell you that the fees WSGC assessed to the Jamestown S'Klallam Tribe under the new model were 50 percent higher than under the old model. I can only assume the fee increase was similar for other tribes.

To now have the agency seeking to extract even more fees from the tribes' vendors which will undoubtedly be passed on to the tribes—is totally unexpected and should have been raised during our compact negotiations. Unilaterally attempting to assess these additional fees now—even indirectly against the tribes—is at odds with the very compact language we just agreed upon. Moreover, it runs counter to the compact's express requirement that the fees you assess on tribes be both actual and reasonable.

We ask that you press pause on your efforts and reevaluate the approach you would take to consult with the tribes. When you have asserted through the entire process that the net effect to your agency will be revenue neutrality and you have many other stakeholders similarly concerned with the dramatic increases they will see under this new proposal, the benefits of a restart far outweigh any risks of time spent getting this right.

Describe the Proposed Change / Background		

The Recreational Gaming Association is requesting the following rule changes:

Promotions (WAC 230-06-030): The proposed change would allow operators to offer gambling promotions that:

- Allow entry based on disclosed criteria;
- Offer lottery tickets as a prize;
- Add additional merchandise or cash prizes to licensed gambling activities;
- Allow licensed manufacturers, distributors, and service suppliers to give licensees cash or merchandise to offer as a prize; and
- Allow card rooms to use a physical drawing, spinning a wheel or selection from a group of concealed items to award a prize.

The proposed change clarifies the process when we review and approve gambling promotions. This occurs when cash or merchandise provided by a licensed manufacturer distributor or service provider for a single gambling promotion is over \$25,000.

Currently, operators offering gambling promotions (1) must offer the promotion to all patrons of their establishments, (2) cannot use second elements of chance (spinning wheels, drawings, etc.) except for bingo operators and (3) cannot offer lottery tickets as prizes.

Use of wheels in promotions (WAC 230-06-031): The proposed change would allow card room licensees to use spinning wheels in conjunction with promotions they offer to customers. Currently, card room licensees cannot use spinning wheels in conjunction with promotions.

At the August meeting, the Commissioners suggested they work with staff and the RGA to add rule language limiting the promotional prizes awarded.

At their October meeting, Commissioners voted to file version 3. The change would allow manufacturers, distributors, and service suppliers to provide prizes to operators for promotions, but such promotions require advance approval by the Director if the cash or merchandise for a single promotion exceeds \$25,000. During that meeting Commissioner Stearns had some questions about when the director would disapprove a plan or promotion. Some additional language has been added, see language highlighted in yellow.

A Small Business Economic Impact Statement was not prepared because the rule change would not impose more than minor costs to licensees.

AMENDATORY SECTION (Amending WSR 14-17-056, filed 8/15/14, effective 9/15/14)

WAC 230-06-030 Restrictions and conditions for gambling promotions. Licensees may conduct gambling promotions to encourage players to participate in ((a)) <u>the</u> gambling activity((, <u>but you must follow</u>)) they are licensed to conduct without our review or approval under these restrictions and conditions:

(1) ((You must give all players an equal opportunity to participate; and

(2))) You must establish ((standards)) rules and restrictions to determine how you will give promotional prizes and items to players((-You must not give the items based on an element of chance, such as a drawing or spinning wheel, unless you are doing so as part of a bingo game)); and

(((3))) <u>(2) You must display all rules and restrictions clearly</u> in the gambling area and include them on promotional materials or advertisements; and

(3) You must give all players eligible for the promotion an equal opportunity to participate; and

(4) Except for members-only progressive raffles conducted as authorized in WAC 230-11-091, you must not give another chance to participate in a gambling activity we regulate as a promotional item; and

(((4) You must display all rules or restrictions clearly in the gambling area and include them on promotional materials or advertisements; and

(5) You must not combine gambling activities and related gambling promotions in any way with a promotional contest of chance as defined in RCW 9.46.0356.))

(5) As part of a gambling promotion, you may add additional merchandise or cash prizes, including increasing payouts for gambling activities you are licensed to conduct; and

(6) Licensed manufacturers, distributors, and service suppliers may give cash or merchandise items to licensed operators to be used as promotional prizes as long as:

(a) The cash or merchandise is offered to all licensed operators; and

(b) The gambling promotion is approved by the director or director's designee when cash or merchandise provided to a licensed operator for a single promotion is over twenty-five thousand dollars; and

(7) In order for a licensed manufacturer, distributor, and service supplier to receive approval, the plan for the gambling promotion must be submitted to the director at least ninety days in advance of the intended start date. The promotion must include sufficient information for the director's approval, comply with all applicable federal and state laws, and include:

(a) The gambling promotion rules and restrictions; and

(b) How the operator will safeguard the prizes; and

(c) How the prizes will be given away; and

(d) The beginning and ending dates for the gambling promotion; and

(e) A detailed prize winner's record to be filled out upon completion of the promotion that includes the winner's name, prizes paid out, date the prize was awarded; and

(f) Any other information we request; and

(8) You must not give promotional prizes or items based on additional elements of chance except that:

(a) Licensed bingo operators are authorized to give promotional prizes or items as part of a bingo game; and

(b) Licensed card rooms are authorized to give promotional prizes or items as part of a physical drawing, spinning a wheel, or selecting from a group of concealed items; and

(9) You must not combine gambling activities and related gambling promotions in any way with a promotional contest of chance as defined in RCW 9.46.0356.

WAC 230-06-031 Using wheels in promotional contests of chance, fund-raising events, or gambling activities.

(3) Operators may use commercially made wheels in gambling activities for fund-raising events.

Separation of PCOCs from gambling activities and promotions

(4) No wheel may be used in conjunction with their gambling activities by((+

(a) Card room licensees; or

(b))) pull-tab licensees.

Card rooms, pull-tabs, bingo, raffles

(5) Licensees and operators must not use professionally manufactured wheels made specifically for gambling activities (for example, Big 6 Wheels) in:

- (a) Bingo; or
- (b) Card games; or
- (c) Pull-tabs.

(6) Operators may use commercially made or home made wheels as part of drawings for prizes, good neighbor prizes, or second element of chance prizes as part of bingo games, as set out in WAC 230-10-280 or to award promotional prizes as set out in WAC 230-06-030.

(7) Raffle licensees and operators may use:

(a) Other types of wheels, such as paddle wheels, in raffles; and

(b) Commercially made or home made wheels in an alternative drawing format for determining the winner of a raffle. Alternative drawing formats are set out in WAC 230-11-055 and 230-11-060.

Licensees may conduct gambling promotions to encourage players to participate in <u>the a</u> gambling activity <u>they are licensed to conduct without our review or approval</u> under these restrictions and conditions:

Amended Section WAC 230-15-685

Restrictions on progressive jackpots.

House-banked card game licensees operating progressive jackpots must follow these restrictions and procedures:

(1) Progressive jackpot funds must accrue according to the rules of the game; and

(2) At each gambling table, licensees must prominently post the amount of the progressive jackpot that players can win; and

(3) Licensees must record the beginning amount of each progressive jackpot offered, including explanations for any increases or decreases in the prize amount offered. Licensees must keep this documentation with the progressive jackpot records; and

(4) Licensees may establish a maximum limit on a progressive jackpot prize. If licensees establish a limit, they must make the amount equal to, or greater than, the amount of the jackpot when they imposed the limit. They must prominently post a notice of the limit at or near the game; and

(5) Licensees may connect progressive jackpots offered on the same card game on multiple tables within the same licensed location.

(6) Licensees may connect progressive jackpots on different card games on multiple tables within the same licensed location when the following requirements are met. Only one progressive jackpot may be operated on a card game at a time and the card games must have:

(a) The progressive is based on Match The Dealer on Blackjack and Match The Dealer on Spanish 21; or the same probability of winning the jackpot prize; and
(b) The same winning hand; and

(c) A progressive meter on each table that increases incrementally each time a wager is made.

(7) When gambling equipment will allow a progressive jackpot between different manufacturers, the gambling equipment must be submitted for testing for interoperability in accordance with WAC 230-06-050.

Amended Section WAC 230-15-040

Requirements for authorized card games.

(1) In order for a card game to be authorized, it must be approved by the director or the director's designee and must:

(a) Be played with standard playing cards or with electronic card facsimiles approved by the director or the director's designee; and

(b) Offer no more than four "separate games" with a single hand of cards and no more than three of the "separate games" may offer a wager that exceeds five dollars each.

(i) "Separate game" means each individual objective to be achieved within a card game that requires a separate wager and results in a distinct and separate pay out based upon the outcome.

(ii) Progressive jackpots are considered "separate games."

(c) Identify "bonus features" to be allowed in each card game:

(i) "Bonus feature" means an added prize and/or variation based on achieving the predetermined specific hand required to win the prize and does not require a separate wager. More than one "bonus feature" may be offered per card game. A "bonus feature" must not may be combined with a progressive jackpot. Examples include, but are not limited to, "envy" and "share the wealth" "bonus features" when operated as described below.

(ii) A "bonus feature" is not considered a separate game.

(d) Operate "envy" and "share the wealth" "bonus features" as follows:

(i) If a player makes a wager that qualifies for an "envy" "bonus feature" pay out, they are entitled to receive a prize if another player's hand achieves the predetermined specific hand. If a player is playing more than one wagering area or if a hand they are playing is split into two or more hands and any one of their hands achieves the predetermined specific hand, their other hand with a qualifying wager is entitled to receive a prize also.

 $(ii) \ If a \ player \ makes \ a \ wager \ that \ qualifies \ for \ a \ "share \ the \ wealth" \ pay \ out, \ they \ are \ entitled \ to \ receive \ a \ prize \ if \ their \ hand(s) \ or \ another \ player's \ hand(s) \ achieves \ the \ predetermined \ specific \ hand.$

(e) Not allow side bets between players.

(2) Card game licensees may use more than one deck of cards for a specific game. They also may remove cards to comply with rules of a specific game, such as Pinochle or Spanish 21.

(3) Players must:

(a) Compete against all other players on an equal basis for nonhouse-banked games or against the house for house-banked games. All players must compete solely as a player in the card game, except as authorized in approved card game rules for variations of the game of Pai Gow poker where a player may bank the game every other hand; and

(b) Receive their own hand of cards and be responsible for decisions regarding such hand, such as whether to fold, discard, draw additional cards, or raise the wager; and

(c) Not place wagers on any other player's or the house's hand or make side wagers with other players, except for:

(i) An insurance wager placed in the game of Blackjack; or

(ii) "Envy" or "share the wealth" "bonus features"; or

(iii) A tip wager made on behalf of a dealer.

(4) Mini-Baccarat is authorized when operated as described in the commission approved game rules on our web site. However:

(a) Card game licensees may make immaterial modifications to the game; and

(b) Subsection (3) of this section does not apply; and

(c) The number of players is limited under WAC 230-15-055.

(5) A player's win or loss must be determined during the course of play of a single card game, except for:

(a) A carryover pot game. A carryover pot is an optional pot that accumulates as a dealer and participating players contribute to the pot. The winner of the pot is not necessarily determined after

one game and the pot can be carried over to more than one game. Carryover pots must not carryover more than ten games. Participants must include at least one player and the dealer competing for the highest qualifying winning hand. Game rules must state how the pot is distributed. If the carryover pot has not been won by the tenth game, the dealer will divide it equally between the remaining players still participating in the pot and the house or, if allowed by game rules, only the players still participating in the pot; and

(b) In the game of Mini-Baccarat, a player may make an optional wager on the player hand winning the next three consecutive games, or the banker hand winning the next three consecutive games.

(c) In Mega Match, a player may be allowed a no-additional-cost entry into a Mega Match Event, which is played with card facsimiles. The player may win an additional amount based on the outcome of the Mega Match Event.

My name is Josh Herschlip, I am the Regional Manager for the Buzz Inn Steakhouse Corporation, This includes representation of the Buzz Inn Steakhouse and Casino located in East Wenatchee. We also previously owned and operated Ace's Casino which was located in Arlington, WA. I'm contacting you regarding potential rule changes. The reason I mention the previous location is these rule changes could have been potential difference makers in our survival. Aces was located within 10 miles of three tribal casinos (Tulalip, Quil Ceda and Angel of the Winds)

*We support the change in the hours of operation. The forcing of closure to our establishments when a potential of business exists and is accessible throughout the state with no limitations creates an unfair advantage as well as limits customer base with staggered schedules. Many occupations include swing shift/ grave yard shifts the forced closure drives that potential business elsewhere.

*We support the changes in promotion allowances. These restrictions put a damper on our creativity and the possibilities of great promotions to entertain our guests. These promotions are how we create excitement about our businesses and generate new business! People like spinning wheels and the excitement of the possibility.

*We support the increased poker wagers. Increasing this wager not only helps level the playing field that exists in our state but makes it less of a conversation to our guests as what the difference of playing poker at a tribal casino and our card rooms. It also allows greater flexibility to games being spread. I believe most people agree poker is a game of skill and proper wagering is an important part of the game and allows players to better protect their investment or wager by betting accordingly to pot size. The greater the spread the better the game. That being said all games approved to be spread or played should allow for he same wager to alleviate confusion to our staffs, agents and guests.

*We support the change in rake structure. Allowing our operations to rake up to 10% of the pot allows for the rooms to absorb portions of the costs that have been added to our day to day operation.(Health Care, Minimum Wage Increase, Restrictive Scheduling, Sick Leave, Salary Structure as well as rising product cost) These are obviously much greater costs than increased rake can fix but it's a step in the right direction for those who offer poker. We are an industry in great need of finding a balance for gaming in our state we need new revenue to just survive, while the current rules allow the same industry to thrive with a few major adjustments to the rules.

Describe the Proposed Change / Background				

Mr. Montney is seeking a rule change to help start a live poker game after a player has been eliminated from a poker tournament.

The petitioner is seeking a rule change to allow Match Play coupons to be awarded to eligible participants of card tournaments as a gambling promotion. The Match Play coupons could then be used by the card tournament players in a live card game after the players finish playing in the card tournament. Players would use their money with the Match Play coupon to place their wager in a live poker game.

After further review by staff, the proposed change to WAC 230-15-453 would not allow Match Play coupons to be awarded as promotional prizes on nonhouse-banked card games, such as poker. WAC 230-15-453 is under the title of "Operating House-Banked Card Games." Any changes to WAC 230-15-453 would impact house-banked card games only, which is not what the petitioner requested.

Based on this, staff proposed a new rule, WAC 230-15-353, which will allow Match Play coupons to be awarded as promotional prizes on nonhouse-banked card games offered by class F and house-banked card room licensees. Commissioners voted to file this rule at the November Commission meeting. This will meet the intent of the petitioner's request.

The proposed rule changes by the Recreational Gaming Association to WAC 230-06-030 (Tab 3), gambling promotions, would be necessary in order to achieve the changes sought by Mr. Montney.

(2) Match play coupons may be used as part of a player's wager. The dealer will exchange the match play coupon for the required amount of chips once the match play coupon is used as part of a player's wager and placed into the pot. Upon redemption, the coupon is no longer valid, it cannot be reused, and must be retained as part of the daily card game records.

(3) Restrictions on the use of coupons must be disclosed on the coupon.

(4) Expiration dates must be included on the coupon.

(5) Match play coupon promotions must be given to all players eligible for the promotion and may be awarded based on the outcome of a card game or tournament.

Susan, I would like to discuss a rule change with you regarding poker. I Have previously asked my Gaming agent about this and he said the law does not currently allow it. I would like to be able to use "blind chips" in live play poker. they would work as follows. We would give them out as " house added money to tournament players or in other promotional ways. They would only be used for the big blind or for the person in the small blind to call the big blind amount. They would have zero cash value. but as soon as they are placed into the pot the house will replace them with live chips.

There would be no rake on those chips. so if there was a PSJ rake the PSJ dollar would not be dropped until someone calls with their own live chips. If a player has only blind chips in front of them they cannot call any raises or bets with blind chips.

If a player has no live chips they would be treated as all in. and all additional action will be in a side pot. I feel this is just one of those rules that never got changed you can use "match play " or "Free play " coupons on house bank games. When the rule was created for poker they made it so you can only use live chips because the pot belongs to the players. As long as the rule applies that the house replaces the Blind Chips with live chips as soon as they hit the pot. the issue of a player being awarded non cash value chips. is moot.

The other issue is that the house needs to be able to decide if "non cash value chips" may go apply towards the minimum buy in.

In years gone buy I filled out rule change request forms. now that link just goes to your email. so if that form still exsists please let me know and I will fill one out. Addendum to rule change request.

As part of the requested rule change I would like clarification to the rule to include the ability to award no cash value chips as house added prizes to a poker tournament in which people pay a fee to participate in .

A sample of how this would work could be the first 6 players knocked out of the poker tournament get \$25 in no cash value chips or coupons with a printed amount on them. the house may stipulate if they may be placed into the pot at any time or only from the blind positions for amounts totaling the amount of the big blind or less.

As soon as they are bet the house will replace them with cash value chips and the game will progress as normal, players who only have non cash value chips will be treated as "all in" for any additional wagering.

This will give us a way to generate a live game from tournament play which is the primary purpose of having tournament play in a poker room.
